Support U.S. Postal Workers; Boycott Staples!

<u>Whereas</u>, the U.S. Postal Service has a <u>no-bid</u>, <u>sweetheart deal</u> with the big-box chain Staples to operate postal counters in more than 80 stores in 4 states, including California;

<u>Whereas</u>, the U.S. Postal Service has plans to expand this operation to more than <u>1,500 Staples</u> store across the United States;

<u>Whereas</u>, these postal counters are staffed by <u>low-wage</u>, <u>high-turnover employees</u> with little training and no credentials to handle U.S. mail;

<u>Whereas</u>, Staples is <u>refusing</u> to staff the postal counters with <u>unionized</u>, <u>uniformed</u> U.S. Postal Service employees who have the training and experience to properly handle U.S. mail, and who have sworn to uphold the highest standards of public service;

<u>Whereas</u>, <u>non-union "postal"</u> jobs at Staples will inevitably <u>replace living-wage</u>, union jobs of U.S. Postal Service employees;

Whereas, current legislation in the U.S. Congress would make it easier to close U.S. Post offices;

<u>Whereas</u>, Communities across the country, such as the city of Berkeley have already experienced disruption and controversy associated with the sale of U.S. post office facilities;

<u>Whereas</u>, consumers are increasingly concerned about identity theft at large retail chains and privatizing the handling of U.S. mail will jeopardize the sanctity and security of the mail;

<u>Whereas</u>, instead of offering lower quality service and selling off public assets, the U.S. Postal Service can and should use its unmatched nationwide network of people and facilities to better serve the public with expanded hours and new services, such as low-cost banking, which could aid millions of low-income consumers;

<u>Whereas</u>, <u>our union / organization</u> cares about public service, protecting good-paying jobs and maintaining universal, affordable mail services for the U.S. public;

<u>Whereas</u>, <u>our union / organization</u> opposes privatization of public services in schools, colleges and universities and other public institutions;

Whereas, our union / organization and postal employees are fighting a common battle against privatization, and

Whereas, many <u>union & organization members</u> & employees frequently purchase school supplies, office supplies, and other products sold at Staples Stores;

Therefore be it resolved that:

- Our union / organization supports the American Postal Workers Union (APWU) in its efforts to protect good-paying jobs and its insistence on the highest possible standards of customer service;
- Be it further resolved that <u>our union / organization</u> opposes efforts by the U.S. Postal Service to privatize operations and to sell off valuable public assets;
- Be it further resolved that members of <u>Our Union / Organization</u>, along with friends, colleagues and family members, are urged to no longer shop at Staples stores until further notice;
- Be if further resolved that <u>Our Union / Organization</u> will submit and advocate this position at all upcoming local, state, and national conventions, rallies, and events: A Boycott of Staples to **begin during the back- to-school** period this summer;
- Be it finally resolved that this call to boycott Staples will be communicated immediately to members of our locals, regional councils, and national bodies, and to our **sister unions & organizations, and to the news media.**
