On April 2, a Peoples Tribunal On Police Violence & Structural Racism will hold its opening session in Harlem, NYC. Over the coming weeks and month, at community hearings across the country, the tribunal will hear testimony from the victims and survivors of police violence along with the insight of activists who have been fighting to end police violence. Later this year the tribunal will hold a final session to present it's findings, conclusions, judgements and recommendations. In the cases of Michael Brown, Eric Garner and many other victims of police violence, the system has let the police go free and helped to perpetuate the police war on Black and Brown young people. The system has failed the people. Now the people will hold their own court.
